Travel Guide

► Transportation Guide (From Major Hubs to Tsinghua University)

Participants may take taxis or ride-hailing services from all major transportation hubs in Beijing to Tsinghua University. Fares vary depending on distance and traffic and can be checked via ridehailing apps.

Public transportation options are as follows:

1) Beijing South Railway Station

• Subway: Take Line 4 (towards Anheqiao North) and get off at Yuanmingyuan Station. Exit to reach the West Gate of Tsinghua University.

2) Beijing Railway Station

• Subway: Take Line 2 (both inner and outer loops are available, the inner loop via Qianmen and Fuxingmen is faster) to Xizhimen Station, then transfer to Line 4 to Yuanmingyuan Station, or transfer to Line 13 to Wudaokou Station, reaching the West Gate or Southeast Gate of Tsinghua respectively.

3) Beijing West Railway Station

• Subway: Take Line 9 to National Library Station, then transfer across the platform to Line 4 and get off at Yuanmingyuan Station (West Gate).

• Bus: From the North Square, take Bus 320; from the South Square, take Bus 982. Both go directly to Tsinghua High School (near student dormitories). Travel time is about 1.5–2 hours, fare around 5 RMB (half-price with transit card).

4) Beijing Capital International Airport (PEK)

- Airport Shuttle Bus: Take Line 5 (Zhongguancun Line) to its terminal at Tsinghua Science Park, then proceed to the Southeast Gate.
- Subway Option 1: Take the Airport Express to Sanyuanqiao Station → transfer to Line 10 (outer loop) → transfer to Line 4 at Haidianhuangzhuang Station → get off at Yuanmingyuan Station (West Gate).
- Subway Option 2: Take Line 10 (outer loop) to Zhichunlu Station → transfer to Line 13 get off at Wudaokou Station (Southeast Gate).
- Travel time: approx. 1+ hour. Fare: 20–30 RMB.

5) Beijing Daxing International Airport (PKX)

- Subway: Take the Daxing Airport Line to Caoqiao Station → transfer to Line 10 → transfer to Line 4 at Jiaomenxi Station → get off at Yuanmingyuan Station. From there, bicycle, taxi, or walk to the West Gate (about 500 m).
- Intercity Railway (Jingxiong Line): Take the train to Beijing West Railway Station, then follow the

- "Beijing West Railway Station" route.
- Airport Shuttle Bus: Currently, there is no direct bus to Tsinghua. Shuttle fares are high (around 40 RMB to Beijing West/South Stations), and transfers are required. Not recommended, except for late-night arrivals.

6) Changping North Railway Station

- Bus: Take Bus 345 to downtown Beijing.
- Subway: From local buses to Changping Line → transfer at Xi'erqi Station to Line 13 → get off at Wudaokou Station.

7) Beijing East Railway Station

 Also known as Hutongdong Station, with limited accessibility. Walk to Dawanglu Station (Line 1) → ride to Xidan Station → transfer to Line 4 → get off at Yuanmingyuan Station.

8) Beijing North Railway Station

- Subway: Adjacent to Line 13 Xizhimen Station. Take 3 stops to Wudaokou Station.
- Bus: From Xizhimen North Bus Terminal, take Bus 375 directly to Tsinghua High School (North Gate).

9) Qinghe Railway Station

- Subway: Convenient transfer to Line 13 within the station. Get off at Wudaokou Station in 2 stops.
- Bus: Bus 305 route adjustment means it no longer directly reaches Tsinghua High School.
